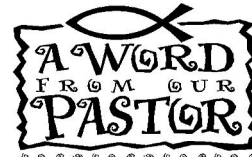

Then, there was a re-convening at about 3:30, for many of the church to travel to Hartland Church of God for an awesome assembly of God's people worshipping and praising Him. A gathering of several churches of different ethnic groups produced some fantastic singing, good preaching and wonderful fellowship.
